Community Grants Scheme

Riccall Parish Council has a limited amount of funding available for Riccall community groups to apply for. In an effort to support its community groups, the Parish Council would like to encourage applications for small grants, up to a maximum of £400. As a Council we are often asked questions about certain concerns, some more often than others, so we hope that you can look at helping us address our residents' concerns.

Dog Fouling: It's a shame that this is still the top topic of conversation. Lets make it clear, not only is it an offence to let your dogs foul the paths around the Village, it is an offence to let them foul Public Spaces, even the footpaths around the allotments. Some dog owners seem to feel it is acceptable to let their dogs foul the paths - **It is not acceptable.**



A volunteer ranger for Sustrans was saying recently, he had carried out a litter pick on the Cycle Track from Riccall to Escrick Sidings and that he only collected a half bag of litter, half a bag too much **BUT** a third of it was dog bags. **The Volunteer carried them back to the bin in the village – Why can't you!!**

Do not throw a dog fouling bag into a hedge or anywhere else, as this is littering and carries the same penalty as dog fouling.

Coppergate: Selby District Council recently wrote to the residents in Coppergate asking if they could keep the highway clear on Mondays as the refuse collecting lorries have been struggling getting down to the bottom end of the street to empty the bins. Can you help by trying to avoid parking down the street especially on bin day. We know some of the cars are often not belonging to residents and some are car owners taking heavy/awkward objects to the nearby allotments or visitors to the school or neighbouring properties. Again we can't stop you parking on any streets but please try to avoid Mondays. While on the subject of recycling – Selby DC are looking at improving their roadside collections i.e. better containers to prevent litter ending up all around the village. In the meantime you could help by not leaving your boxes out too early and weight the lid down so that the contents don't blow all over. Recently a youngster (I don't believe he is a teenager yet!!) was seen in the village picking up the litter around the park area – his comment "this is hurting the world"

Hedges: It's that time of year again when the greenery is growing, especially hedges. The Council have often written to tenants asking them to cut back their hedges on the roadside and down public footpaths. **This doesn't mean just the new growth—it means cutting the hedge back to your boundary.**



Footpaths: When out in the fields around the village, just remember they are in most cases private land. For example, the fields either side of the Allotments, behind the School at the bottom of Coppergate **are not public right of ways, they are private land and you are trespassing if you walk them.** The Riccall Lands Charity are losing valuable income as dog walkers are allowing their dogs to foul on their fields and therefore they cannot be used for growing crops

Street-lights: Many of the street-lights in the village are owned by the Parish Council and the rest are owned by North Yorkshire. If on your travels around the village you see any that are not on - please ring us on 01757 249222 with the location and the number on the post. We are happy to report both those belonging to the Parish Council and North Yorkshire's.

**North Yorkshire Community Messaging**

An ongoing TV Licensing phishing campaign that begun in September 2018 has been identified by the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau. There have been over 250 crime reports made in relation to the campaign with cumulative losses in excess of £2 million. Individuals receive a TV Licensing phishing email with links to a convincing-looking website. The website requests that the victim provides personal and financial details. The victims subsequently receives a phone call from a fraudster claiming to be from the fraud department of the victim's bank. The fraudsters convince victims they are genuine banking staff by providing some of the personal details that were obtained using the fake TV Licensing emails and websites. The fraudster states that the victim's account has been compromised, possibly by a phishing scam they may have fallen victim to recently, and states that they need to transfer their money to a new 'safe account'.

How you can protect yourself:

- Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.
- Don't assume a phone call or email is authentic, even if someone knows your basic details (such as your name or address). Remember, criminals can spoof phone numbers and email addresses to appear as companies you know and trust, such as TV Licensing.
- Your bank will never call and ask you for your PIN, full banking password, or ask you to transfer money out of your account.

What to do if you've fallen victim:

- Let your bank know as soon as possible and monitor your bank statements regularly for any unusual activity.
- If you suspect your identity may have been stolen you can check your credit file quickly and easily online. Use a reputable service provider and follow up on any unexpected or suspicious results.
- If you have been a victim of fraud or cyber-crime, report it to Action Fraud at actionfraud.police.uk, or by calling 0300 123 2040.





The group was recently set up involving volunteer members from Riccall, Kelfield and The Hollicarrs holiday park. It was initially funded by the Eastern Community Engagement forum and Riccall Parish Council to provide assistance and support during times of emergency such as flooding, major power loss, etc. The group has access to numerous resources which in the event of emergency could ease the strain on disruption to human life until further assistance can be provided by North Yorkshire County Council.

I am the new Chairman, I live at Hollicarrs and I am actively seeking further volunteers from the Riccall area to step forward to assist with such incidents. Volunteers from both Kelfield and Hollicarrs would be only too happy to step forward and assist if the need arose. I am not seeking people to dig trenches or run into burning buildings but people to offer comfort, provide a cup of tea and support where required in designated buildings at the site of any potential emergency. I know that in the event of any such emergency we would all pull together and assist where and how we could but I am trying to put an organised and structured plan together to make dealing with any incident that more bearable on everyone. There is no commitment in volunteering, we hope never to call on your services, but it would be that much easier knowing in the event of an emergency I have people to call upon who are willing and able to assist. Once I have sufficient numbers, I can arrange training in first aid and communications to assist in our role.
