Quality Status awarded to Riccall PC

The Council was delighted to hear in May this year that it has been awarded 'Quality Status.' The aim of this scheme has always been to provide benchmark minimum standards for Parish and Town Councils and to help Councils achieve even higher levels of professionalism and help to cement their position as community leaders.



Riccall Parish Council submitted a portfolio of evidence showing information on policies, procedures, annual reports, electoral mandates, meetings, communication and community engagement, accounts, code of conduct, promoting local democracy and citizenship, ongoing training and the professional qualifications of the Clerk and Finance Officer. The information was assessed by an independent panel of experts, who congratulated Riccall Parish Council on a 'very good application' and were very happy to award the benchmark of 'Quality Status.'

Riccall Parish Council is now recognised as being within the top 4% of local councils nationally. We are proud of the Council and of our Community in Riccall and hope that you are too.

What's going on with Council projects this year?



Westfield junior football project

Planning permission has now been granted for the development of junior football facilities on Westfield in Riccall. An updated feasibility study has been completed and a topographical survey of the land is taking place as this newsletter goes to print. The Council will shortly be going out to tender for the project and applying for funding. Initial meetings with the FA have been positive, with support pledged. Meetings with Riccall Utd Junior Football Club continue as the Club and the Council work with a common aim. Thanks to the great work of the club, junior teams are already thriving in Riccall (as you will read about on page 6),

The Council is considering a new Christmas lights project for Riccall. Plans at the moment involve a few lights that will be wall mounted and on street light columns in the central part of the village, plus a re-vamp of the large tree on the Village Green. A19 delays!



You may well have heard by now that the City of York Council is undertaking major maintenance work at the A19 between the A64 interchange and Escrick. The work involves the installation of a new highway drainage system followed by reconstruction and resurfacing of the carriageway. At the same time, the carriageway will be widened at Deighton village. Work begins on 7th June and is programmed to take 16 weeks working every day including weekends between 6am and 10pm under 24 hr temporary traffic signals. As work progresses, carriageway reconstruction and resurfacing will follow on as and when required, working Monday to Friday overnight between 9pm and 6am. In order to carry out this night time work, phased road closures will be necessary with signed diversion routes for local traffic. For further information contact York City Council on (01904) 553086. Why do they exist?

The organisations involved have a commitment to listen to local communities and act on what they hear. CEFs allow you to make your point once to everyone and all organisations can work together to

solve the issue or improve things.

What else do they do for local communities?

Each CEF has a set amount of funding available. £20,000 per year is available to the Eastern CEF group (which covers Riccall) as part of a commitment from Selby District Council to support local decision making through the Community Engagement Forums.

Where do I fit in?

The Forum meetings give you a chance to speak directly to the people delivering your local services, for example policing, street cleaning and road safety. 





Some news and updates from Selby District Council.....

Get rid of your junk and save the world—without leaving home!

Do you need a Barlby High school uniform? Are you looking for an 8mm cine projector? How about a Freeview box or an Ikea single bed? These are just some of the items that have been offered for free on the Selby Freecycle website since the start of this year. Freecycle is an online network of people who give and get items for free—it's all about re-use and keeping things out of landfill sites. Visit www.freecycle.org for more information and to become a member.



Changes to payments at Access Selby

From 1st June this year, Selby DC will stop taking cash at its customer contact offices for things such as Council Tax or housing rents, as the authority looks to make better use of its resources to meet residents' needs. Data shows that few residents make cash payments at Access Selby but to offer the service costs the Council money because of the need for security on site and in order to transfer cash to a bank. It is estimated that the change will save approximately £12,000 per year. People will still be able to make cash payments, should they wish to, via their local Post Office or Payzone facilities in local shops. A list of participating locations is available from Access Selby or online. For most customers direct debit continues to be the easiest and most convenient way to make payments.



Council Thanks for Selby residents' Recycling

Less waste in landfill sites and more recycling—that's how Selby residents have responded to the introduction of the Council's alternate bin collection service. Early indications show a significant increase in recycling tonnages and also a reduction in the amount of waste sent to landfill sites since the introduction of alternate bin collections in October last year. The new kerbside collections of plastics have proved extremely popular with residents. Collection crews have picked up over 46 tonnes of plastic during October, rising to nearly 57 tonnes in December last year. That is about the same weight as about 40 small family cars collected in just one month. Households in Selby District can now recycle about 70% of all their household waste. Residents are reminded that they can find out more about the service within a dedicated Street Scene section on the District Council website www.selby.gov.uk





Traffic update

You will have noticed the trial vehicle activated sign near to the Recreation Ground on Main Street, which was in place for about a week. Unfortunately the results of the trial showed slight differences on the results of traffic speed whether the sign was there or not, therefore North Yorkshire Highways will not be giving us permission to have a permanent sign in this location. We should have further details on the planned double yellow line scheme for Station Rd and part one-way scheme for Back Lane shortly.

Riccall Neighbourhood Watch



About fifty villagers gathered for our 2009/10 AGM in the Village Institute on the 21st April. Chairman Bob Owens welcomed all of those present, including guest speakers Sgt Lesley Syson of North Yorkshire Police and Emily Murphy of Selby District Community Safety Partnership.

The Treasurer reported that our membership had reached the level of 508 households, an increase of 24 over the previous year. A good achievement, and above average for NHW groups locally.

The Chairman gave a review of the past year's performance, followed by reports by the Village Co-ordinator and the Riccall Parish Council representative. Thanks were also expressed to NY Police and Selby District Community Safety Partnership representatives for their continued support.



The assembled company were reminded that RNHW was there to help residents to take appropriate action to stay safe from crime and the RNHW would continue to assist members with help and advice. The Parish Council had again been a great support over the last twelve months and an emergency communications system had been agreed with them, to alert residents as quickly as possible in the event of a village emergency.

Riccall NHW now has a shared section of the Village Green Parish Council notice board. The details of the regular village visits by the Mobile Police Unit are listed. Casual visits by the Police will continue at the Methodist Chapel Thursday Coffee Mornings.



Changes within North Yorkshire Police were mentioned, specifically the PCSOs who cover our area. Alison Marshall and Rachel Thompson have moved on, and Adam Wood and Carolyn Ward will now be around in Riccall.

There have been some recent examples of fly tipping in Riccall, near to the Recreation Ground. Fly tipping fines are up to £20,000 and/or 6 months imprisonment. Fines are unlimited if the case goes to Crown Court and culprits can face up to 2 years imprisonment, rising to 5 years in the case of hazardous waste. If you see anyone dumping waste in our community, please pass on their details and allow us to take action. It is an expensive problem to solve for us all.





Spitfire marked opening on National Nature Reserve (NNR) at Skipwith Common

Seventy years ago Skipwith Common would have resonated to the sound of heavy bombers taking to the sky, and in May once again a Second World War Spitfire swooped over North Yorkshire this month to celebrate the opening of England's newest National Nature Reserve.



Once part of RAF Riccall, nature and the efforts of Natural England and landowners, Escrick Park Estate have restored the common to how it was centuries ago providing a habitat for rich and varied wildlife. Now adders and grass snakes lurk in defunct bomb bunkers, while shallow ponds dug out of runways support vast quantities of great crested newts. Occupying 274 hectares, the site is home to a wide variety of rare heathland plants, a rich collection of dragonflies and more than 70 species of breeding birds including nightjars and woodlarks.



The Spitfire flew past a newly dedicated memorial to the RAF personnel who served at the site before heading to Elvington where it made a low-level pass along the old runway beside the Yorkshire Air Museum, followed by a roll into the sky to salute those commemorated.



In addition to the official dedication, events over the weekend included sheep dog trials, falconry and walks, demonstrations and family activities and we estimate that around 1500 members of the public were involved with some aspect of the celebration, with about 40% of these being children from local communities.



Recipe Corner - Coleslaw

- 450g white cabbage, finely shredded


A disco will follow on from this starting approx 4pm – in the main hall at the Regen.
