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RICCALL COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PLAN



There are some things in life that we can plan for like holidays and birthdays. Then there are others that take us by surprise. Life is not always predictable. Are you aware that Riccall Parish Council, in conjunction with other partners has produced a Community Emergency Plan? As always the emergency services are the primary responders to all incidents. Our aim is to work alongside other agencies to provide a comprehensive response to the needs of those affected by any emergency situation.

Emergencies can significantly disrupt our daily lives and whilst we can't prevent that happening, we can plan ahead to minimise the impact. Our plan identifies potential crisis situations which could include serious road traffic accidents, flooding, fire or environmental pollution. All of which we have experienced in Riccall at one time or another. This may help us to respond, including roles, responsibilities and actions. Our immediate focus is to protect life and property wherever we can, and then to help Communities recover as quickly as possible. This is where we can engage with partners like the Environment Agency, adjoining villages like Hollicarrs and Kelfield, local community groups and the emergency services.

We have presented our plan to NYCC so they can review it and we are hoping to raise funding from support groups to enhance vital equipment.

As always it is the people of the village that are the key to a successful plan. There is a wealth of expertise, knowledge and resources already in our communities. We proved our resourcefulness during the recent floods when a herculean effort was made.

The simple Community Emergency Plan is designed to identify:

- A coordination/meeting point.
- Short-term safe refuge places for people displaced from their homes.
- Emergency volunteers.
- Useful emergency equipment (including Sandbags)
- Vulnerable people in the community and support for them.
- Useful emergency contacts.

Defibrillators for Riccall

You may recall an article in the Beacon last year informing you that the village has a de-fib located outside Beechtree Surgery. It is hoped we will never have to use it but if we do then here are is a reminder of what process you need to follow:



If you are with someone who has a suspected heart attack, in the first instance **DIAL 999** ask for the ambulance service and they will assist you from then on. The operator will ask for the post code and will tell you where the nearest de-fib is situated and give you the relevant information you need to access the equipment and more importantly how to use it. It is straightforward and the equipment will not let you shock a person if it is not necessary.

Good news – we have been successful in applying for a second de-fib from the British Heart Foundation, provided free of charge. (The first one and the cabinet cost over £1500.)

Where is it? - it is located at the Regen Centre, on the side wall facing the Bowls/Tennis Club. As above, dial 999 and the ambulance service will assist you .

How can you help? - it is important that as many villagers, friends and family know how to use it in the form of some basic training. There are two options:

1/there are residents who have completed the training and others who would assist by running further one hour training sessions . We have no dates set yet but it will be preferable if we had 10 people per session to reduce costs.

2/the BHF supplied us with 10 manikins and instructions on how to use them, all you need is access to a computer or CD/DVD to teach yourself. All we will ask is for a donation for the ongoing maintenance cost to support the two de-fibs as the battery life is 5/7 years and pads need to be changed every two years if they haven't been used, if the unit is used, then the pads have to be replaced.

As the latest de-fib was given to us by the BHF, when you next see one of their collection boxes or charity stalls, please drop some coins in the box or support their event. No one knows whether we will be unfortunate to need to use it but it is reassuring to know we now have TWO close to hand in our village.

Superfast broadband ‘Not spots ‘ on Main Street and Station Road sorted.

I am pleased to report that 49 more properties in Riccall along Main Street and Station Road can now access superfast broadband. The network serving Riccall was upgraded in 2014 but it was found that a number of properties on Main Street and Station Road had their telephone lines connected directly to the telephone exchange. This meant that they by-passed the new superfast broadband cabinets. These lines have now all been re-routed via the new equipment. This means that superfast broadband with speeds of between 25Mbps and 80Mbps is now available across the whole of the village. The upgrade is not automatic because new equipment is required. The upgrade has to be ordered but when you do so most suppliers deliver the upgrade very quickly. It is very popular, so much so that it is not unusual for 50% or more customers to upgrade. To see which companies offer superfast broadband and to check availability visit <http://www.superfastnorthyorkshire.com/providers> Across North Yorkshire Superfast broadband is now available to 88% of properties and more villages are being added all the time. Kelfield and many other villages will be completed in the next Phase which runs until June 2017. North Yorkshire County Council has recently confirmed that another £20.5M has been made available for a third Phase which will take availability to 95%. For those who still cannot get access there is the option of a subsidised satellite broadband service. If you require further information please contact my office or Superfast North Yorkshire. I would like to thank those people in the village who have written to me asking about Broadband availability, hopefully this is the good news that you have been waiting for.

Parking issues

The Parish Council receives numerous complaints about parking in the village, especially around school time and about vehicles parked partially on the footpath.

We have discussed this problem with the Police Community Support Officers responsible for the village and have adopted the following strategy. A 'Parking Notice' has been put together and recently two members of the council walked around the village with the PCSO's. The guidelines used by the police are that if a double buggy can get by the vehicle parked on the footpath they will not ticket that vehicle. On the walk round we put notices on 20 vehicles that were parked in contravention of the guidelines—this was an educational exercise.

Many houses in the village have driveways long enough for up to two vehicles and we would ask that people make use of these rather than take the easy option of parking on the footpath.



At school times we would ask drivers to give due thought to the safe position of the parked vehicle and if it is causing inconvenience to any residents near where it is parked. In future if notices are placed on vehicles we will make a note of the registered number and time and place which will be passed to the PCSO's so that they can put tickets on these vehicles if seen illegally parked.

We hope that you will support us and help improve the safety for pedestrians around the village.


Hedge cutting





Changing Places at the Regen Centre

The Regen Centre was designed to be accessible to all, but we wish to extend our facilities even further by adapting one of our changing rooms for the use of older children and adults with disabilities. The main items required are an electric height adjustable changing table, a ceiling hoist, and a height adjustable washbasin, which alone will cost £12,500. We also wish to install two pairs of fully automatic swing doors with a remote push button at our main entrance. These will benefit not only those with disabilities but also users with pushchairs. These new facilities which will cost some £35,000 in total, will work alongside our existing disability friendly measures, including recently installed facilities for the hard of hearing.

An apiary has been constructed in one of the allotment areas with beehives already in place, so if anyone would like to discuss keeping bees, please get in touch with us.


Our annual plant sale in May was successful and added some much needed funds.



Dam meadows

The meadows around Riccall Dam are used by many walkers but are you aware that much of this area is not public footpath? There are two Public Rights of Way, as shown on the map(short dotted line) and each cross a bridge but there is no PROW connecting the two. Recently the farmer has approached a number of dog walkers requesting them to pick up after their dogs as the hay which he harvests and uses for animal feed is being contaminated with dog faeces and can lead to abortion when fed to cattle which is a real cause for concern. Please consider the farmers point of view and use the PROW's. The farmer would be happy for walkers to keep to the village side of the dam and stay on the existing path alongside the Dam, with dogs on leads and pick up after them. Continuing misuse may result in the area being fenced off as the only solution for the farmer to control the situation, which would be a real loss for walkers. We are really lucky to have such wonderful walks on our doorsteps— lets keep it that way.
